FIRE DEPARTMENT.

HEADQUARTERS FIRE DEPARTMENT, CITY OF NEW YORK, JANUARY 8, 1879.

Present—Commissioners Joseph L. Perley in the chair, and John J. Gorman. The minutes of meetings held 30th and 31st, ultimo, were read and approved.

Trials.

Fireman John E. Hyatt, of Engine Co. No. 4, charged with "conduct prejudicial to good order." Accused and witness absent, and case laid over. Private Frank Kelly, of Engine Co. No. 4, charged with "absence without leave" and "neglect of duty." Found guilty and dismissed the service of the Department, from 9th inst.

Fireman Paul Schuck, of Hook and Ladder Co. No. 4, charged with "intoxication." Found guilty and fined three days' pay. Fireman Henry T. Hart, of Hook and Ladder Co. No. 6, charged with "being under the influence of liquor." Evidence taken and laid over.

Fireman Thomas W. Relyea, of Engine Co. No. 30, charged with "neglect of duty." Evidence taken and laid over. The following resolution was, on motion, adopted: Resolved, That the pay-rolls of the several bureaus and superintendents be made to conform to the amounts allowed therefor in the annual estimate fixed by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for the current year.

The following preamble and resolution were offered, and on motion, laid over: Whereas, The practice of detailing officers and members of the uniformed force for the purpose of altering and repairing the buildings in use by this department, has been shown by its results to be neither economical, nor for the best interests of the city; therefore, be it Resolved, That the Chief of Department be and he is hereby directed to order the immediate return to their respective companies of all officers and members of the uniformed force who are detailed for the purpose of altering and repairing the buildings in use by this Department, and that he be further directed to designate a competent officer with instructions to make a thorough inspection of all of said buildings, and to make a detailed report, in writing, at the earliest practicable moment, of all the repairs and alterations required to be made to the aforesaid buildings.
