SIR—There were 621 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, June 6, 1885, which is a decrease of 37, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 9 less than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1884. The actual mortality for the week ending May 30, 1885, was 658, which is 6.8 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 24.55 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,393,937.
