BOARDS OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS.

BOROUGH OF QUEENS.

The Local Board of the Borough of Queens held its regular weekly meeting in the Hackett Building, in the forenoon of October 21, 1898, at which was President Frederick Bowley, with Councilman Joseph Cassidy and Alderman William F. James.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and duly approved.

The President called the matter of complaint against the alleged maintenance of smoke nuisance by Long Island Railroad Company, whereupon counsel for said company appeared and addressed the Board in effect, to wit: That it is the desire and aim of the corporation to minimize the objectionable results from the use of soft coal, the use of same being unavoidable by reason of the construction of the grate surfaces in locomotive boilers for hauling freight trains not being sufficient in area to burn hard coal. That some of the fault is to be attributed to the carelessness of employees in not strictly complying with the rules of the company; and that he was notified this morning that the company would at once issue such orders in relation thereto, the observance of which should aid to reduce the matter complained of in some degree, and ought to be readily

observable by those affected thereby; and concluded, that action by the Board thereon be deferred until such time, sufficient for the matter suggested to prove itself beneficial, and the persons who complained be again heard from, when, upon notice given, his company would again put in an appearance before the Board. Thereupon the Board proceeded to act upon other business, and the representative of the Long Island Railroad Company withdrew. Dr. Kennedy, one of the complainants against the Long Island Railroad Company, who just arrived at this stage, made apology that he was detained by the representative of the company in relation to him the remarks he had made in behalf of the company to this Board. He declared to this Board that he placed no reliance upon any offers to abate the smoke nuisance, as the company made such-like years ago. That the railroad company had purchased five new engines with fire boxes and grate surface space suitable for the burning of hard coal only, and asked that this Board take the necessary steps in the matter so as to have it placed properly before the Health Board.

On motion of Councilman Cassidy, it was ordered that communication be sent to the Long Island Railroad Company, that the complainants are opposed to this Board accepting the offer made by the railroad company's representative as insufficient to abate the smoke nuisance; and that if matters are not improved satisfactorily by time of next meeting of this Board, on 28th instant, at which the subject will be taken up again, this Board will then and there proceed in such manner as may be required in the premises.

Communication from Department of Health, City of New York, in relation to "Barren Island nuisance," dated October 12, 1898, the concluding paragraph of which is:

"The work will be completed in about eighteen days from date unless it was found necessary to make further changes, as the methods to be used are new and the defects, if any, cannot always be detected until trials are made from time to time," was read and ordered to be placed on file.

Communication from Comptroller, dated 19th instant, in regard to the failure to proceed with the construction of public sewer in Webster avenue, First Ward, Borough of Queens, and copy of report of expert accountant relating thereto, were read, ordered received, to be filed, and consideration thereof laid over to next meeting. Alderman James offered the following, which, on motion, was duly adopted.

Whereas, The trustees of the late Village of Flushing, now in the Third Ward of the Borough of Queens, granted to the New York and West Shore Railway Company a franchise to lay rails on Sanford avenue, near Bayne avenue, through Bowne to Forrest, to Parsons, to Franconia, to Twenty second street to the Cemetery; and

Whereas, It has been stated that such company intends to run its tracks in variance with that as set forth in the franchise as aforesaid, to wit: That where such route as that established intersects with Queens avenue, such last-named avenue is to be used by them for such purpose to the Cemetery. Now, in view of the foregoing and that such transgressed application of the use of said avenue will be detrimental to said avenue, especially in its improved condition; therefore

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Highways be and he is hereby respectfully requested to refuse the issuance of permit to the New York and West Shore Railway Company to lay its tracks on Queens avenue as aforesaid.

On motion, adjourned to the 28th instant.

Estimated for the furnishing of paper required for ballots by the Primary Election Law having been invited and received, and the J. W. Pratt Company being the lowest bidder, and having offered to furnish such paper for such ballots in size, color, form and texture as adopted by this Police Board, at a rate of 20.83 per 1,000 ballots for the Republican Party, and 22.22 per 1,000 ballots for the Democratic Party, it is

Resolved, That said bid of the J. W. Pratt Company be accepted and that an agreement be made by and between this Board and the said J. W. Pratt Company to be prepared by the Superintendent of Elections, by which the said J. W. Pratt Company will agree to furnish such quantity of said ballots as may be required, and to be delivered at such place or places as may be required by this Board, said J. W. Pratt Company to collect and receive from the persons desiring to purchase said paper the price therefor, the Police Board being in nowise responsible for the value of the same, and that an agreement to that effect be entered into by and between the said J. W. Pratt Company and the Superintendent of Elections in behalf of the Police Board.
