

The Board of Public Improvements of The City of New York met at the office of the Board, No. 21 Park row, on Wednesday, July 10, 1901, at 2 o'clock v. M., pursuant to notice.

The roll was called and the following members were present and answered to their manes:

General Res.—Although just now I am staying out of town, I am a live-long New Yorker, having in field in the City state 1852. My home is now to the Ibacough of Brooklyn since 1858, and that it a part of the enlarged New York.

As a resident, these force, I as once who walls a public in our greatest American city, I send this letter to the pathlic hearing amenanced in the papers for to-morrow afternoon, concurring the preservation of Prannec's Taverin, where Washington took leave of his officers, and the creation of a small park around it.

Gentlement of the Board, the loss or removal of that place would be an everlasting discrace in our city. We could put up a building in its place made of salid gold and set with all the diamonds of South Africa, but it would not compare in value to the place buildowed forever by the presence of the Pather of his Country, on that great historical occasion. It is already a shame to New York and the country that so many spots bound up with our heroic period bave been destroyed and bost. In the name of all that we value, and prize as Americans, do not let this happen any more. It is robbing our children and our children's children of priceless treasures, to permit uch losses through putty occuring at lastiness great.

Madera buildings, once lost, can never be replaced by any human power or wealth. As an American and as a New Yorker, I do beg meet earnestly for the honer of our city and for the rights of our posterity in generations to come that you will surely see to it that this Inilding, hallowed by the great memory of Washington, is saved and secured to the meteopolis. All patriotic entrems will honor you for so doing, both now and for long to come.
