Dear Sir—Your proposition of September 28, 1904, to furnish and erect nine arc lamps of either General Electric Company or Fort Wayne Company's manufacture, black finish, located as follows, for the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine dollars and eighty-seven cents (\$129.87):  
1 on grounds in front of Female Almshouse.  
2 on grounds in rear of Female Almshouse.  
1 at intersection of roadway leading to new barn and the main roadway of grounds.  
3 of these lamps for church.  
1 of these lamps for bakery.  
1 of these lamps for Morgue.

Mr. F. G. BLANCHARD, No. 45 Willoughby Street, Brooklyn:  
Dear Sir—Your proposition of September 28, 1904, to furnish and erect on grounds, etc., of Kings County Buildings, 4 iron arc lamp-posts, located as follows:  
1 on grounds in front of Female Almshouse.  
2 on grounds in rear of Female Almshouse.  
1 at intersection of roadway leading to new barn and the main roadway of grounds.  
Each of the lamp-posts to be complete with windlass for lowering lamps and to have a switch in base of post to control the lamp.  
Style of lamp-posts to be in accordance with blue print submitted of design No. 55 A.  
The 4 lamp-posts to be properly set in a suitable casing of concrete and the vitrified duct leading to same to be made water-tight at the point of junction with the concrete casing, and the present lead-covered wire which is on present wooden poles to be brought through the iron lamp-posts to the point where wires emerge from same and from this point suitable duplex stranded wire to be spliced to the lead wire and carried in a loop to the lamp so that same may be raised or lowered to trim.  
You also propose to wire for 12 incandescent lights in boiler-room arranging 1 light for each water column and 1 light for each of the steam gauges, 6 boilers, 2 lights to each boiler. Total, 12 lights.  
The wiring for these lights to be done in loricated pipe fastened to the back of boiler fronts with sockets and metal half shade reflectors brought at a correct angle to properly light the above-mentioned water columns and steam gauges.  
The whole of the work to be done in a good electrical and mechanical manner and left ready for use.  
The price for above work complete being four hundred and ten dollars and thirteen cents (\$410.13) is accepted, and you are hereby notified to proceed with the work.
