







No hid shall be accented from or contract worded to any present who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is in a defaulter, as surely so otherwise, upon any solitation of the City.

The contract must be hid for apparately. The right is reserved in such case to reject all side or estimates it it is deemed to be for the interest of the City as to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of twice hids or estimates to addition to inserting the same in figures.
