### Communications Transmitted.

Factory building which was used for making shoes and clothing, for the storing of prisoners' clothing and valuables, and for storage of material, was entirely destroyed. No life was lost. Records of commitments to the Reformatory, Harts Island, were burned.

In accordance with section 47 of the Greater New York Charter, as amended by chapter 400 of the Laws of 1904, an issue of Corporate Stock of The City of New York, to the amount of \$100,000 for the erection and completion of louidings on Harts Island, is requested. Several specimens may be examined at a single inspection. Samples taken and analyzed. The technical definition of adulteration is found in section 51 of the Sanitary Code, the chief items being "containing less than 12 per centum of milk solids" and "containing less than 3 per centum of late. In enforcement a distinction is made between samples whose milk solids are found between 12 per cent, and 11.4 per cent,: the former are made occasions for warning only, the latter fits procession.

## Orders Issued by the Board of Health.

Orders of the Board for the abatement of nuisances are issued under the supervision of the Assistant Sanitary Superintendents in the various Boroughs, upon the facts and evidence contained in the written reports of the Sanitary Inspectors, the result of personal inspection of premians complained of. These orders call the attention of owners, lessees and agents to violations of the Sanitary Code and Health Laws in each case, and require the necessary alteration, repairs, cleaning and improvement of the premises named within three days from the receipt of the order. If, upon reinspection, it is found that the requirements of the order have not been complied with a sait for penalty is commenced against the delinquents under sections 1172 and 1222, chapter 466, Laws of 1901.

## Searches and Transcripts of Births, Marriages and Deaths.

Certified copies of the records of vital statistics as may be found to be on file in the Bureau of Records are furnished to applicants authorized to receive same, namely, interested parties, next of kin, legal representatives, etc., upon payment of the fee in such cases prescribed by the Board of Health. Written orders are signed by the Assistant Chief Clerk in the various Borought and issued to the Assistant Registrar of Records, authorizing the search and issuence of a transcript of the record, which, in accordance with the regulations of the Board, is authorized by affixing the seal of the Department of Health, and attested by the signature of the Assistant Chief Clerk of the Borough. When search is made and the record is not found to be on file, an official certificate is issued to that effect.
