On June 30, 1909, the total force was 9,932. In addition there were on probation 272 Partolmen, besides 1 Surgeon and 2 Doormen.

Effective force, 8,026; with leave, 4:0; without leave, 1; siek, 247; suspended, 1; detailed by Police Commissioner, 848; detailed in courts, public offices, etc., salaries not paid by Police Department, 409.
