# POLICE DEPARTMENT.

## REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDED JUNE 30, 1927.

Hon. James J. Walker, Mayor of The City of New York, City Hall, New York: Sir-Pursuant to section 1544 of the Charter of The City of New York, I hereby submit the quarterly report of the operations and action of the Police Department, covering the period from April 1 to June 30, 1927, inclusive.

Crimes of Violence.

The operations of the Police Department, so far as they relate to crimes of violence -murder, assault and robbery, burglary and felonious assault-must be judged by the success of the police, not only in the apprehension of those who commit such crimes but also the prevention of such crimes by effective patrol work.

The crime records for the period covered by this report indicate a marked decrease in crimes of violence in this City. Burglaries. Murder or manslaughter cases during the second quarter of 1927 totaled 67, as compared with 72 for the corresponding period last year and 81 in 1925, a decrease of 7 per cent. from last year and of 17 per cent. from 1925. It is interesting to note that 12 of the 67 murder victims during the last three months, or 18 per cent., had criminal

Grand Larceny.

In this connection it may be well to point out that it is in the matter of curtailing automobile thieves and pickpockets that the police have a real opportunity to exercise methods of crime prevention. The second quarter of 1927 shows a decrease in automobile thefts over the corresponding period of 1926 of 10 per cent., while there were only 2 pickpocket cases involving grand larceny reported, as opposed to 8 in the previous year, a decrease of 75 per cent.

License Bureau.

During the second quarter of 1927 the License Bureau of the Police Department issued the following licenses: Public hack drivers, 16,474; public hacks, 8,370; pistol permits, 1,012; religious meetings, 171.

The investigating squad of the Bureau also made 1,425 investigations for the Department of Licenses during the same period. The Boiler Squad tested 4,708 boilers and issued a total of 364 certificates to engineers, ice machine operators and firemen. Conclusion.

In presenting this report, permit me to call your attention to the fact that it covers not only a part of my incumbency, but also the last 12 days of the administration of my predecessor, George V. McLaughlin. Commissioner McLaughlin left a wellorganized, finely-equipped department, which it has been my constant effort to keep. on the high plane on which I found it.

The increase in the man power of the Department, made possible by the action of your Honor and the Board of Estimate during the administration of my predecessor, has, I feel, been an important factor in bringing about the results indicated in this report. Let me add that, in my opinion, the expenditure necessary to provide the additional men and equipment is amply justified by the increased measure of protection

of the lives and property of the citizens of this City. The deterrent effects of the so-called Baumes Laws and the co-operation of the District Attorneys and the courts in the prompt and vigorous prosecution and sentencing of those charged with serious crimes have been of material aid to the Department. In this connection I wish to point out the more severe sentences have been of benefit, not only in preventing crimes by the fear of long sentences, but also by keeping in custody desperate and habitual criminals who formerly have been released after comparatively short prison terms to pursue their careers of crime.

The greatest factor in crime prevention, however, is, I feel, the high character of the men of the uniformed force and detective division, whose energy, self-sacrifice and devotion to duty are chiefly responsible for the results shown. JOSEPH A. WARREN, Police Commissioner. Respectfully,

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said department and read, and the award of the condepartment and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter

tract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.
